

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

### Copyright

Authors submit a manuscript on the condition that it has been read and approved by all co-authors. Submission of the manuscript implies the authors' agreement that, if accepted, the work will be published under the Creative Commons [CC BY-SA 4.0](#) license. This license permits unrestricted use, reproduction, distribution, and adaptation of the work, including for commercial purposes, provided that appropriate credit is given to the original authors and that any derivative works are distributed under the same license. The submitted work must be the authors' original work and must not have been published elsewhere in any language without the prior written consent of the publisher.

### Manuscript Submission Guidelines

Authors from abroad should submit manuscripts in English. Slovenian authors are encouraged to submit their manuscripts in both Slovenian and English. The manuscript should be between 6 and 15 A4 pages in length, including tables and figures, using Times New Roman, 12 pt font. The manuscript must be prepared as a Microsoft Word document. Manuscripts must be submitted by the deadline specified by the publisher (The Slovenian Foundry Society) via e-mail to [drustvo.livarjev@siol.net](mailto:drustvo.livarjev@siol.net). Upon receipt of the manuscript, the publisher will arrange for language editing, any necessary translation, and peer review.

### Manuscript Structure

The manuscript must follow the journal template and include:

- Before the title in first line: author(s)' full name(s), in second line: affiliation(s) and country of the author(s);
- Title;
- Abstract;
- Keywords;
- Introduction; Chapters; Discussion/Conclusion;
- References: a complete list of cited sources at the end of the manuscript.

### References

References must be listed at the end of the manuscript and numbered in the order in which they appear in the text.

Each reference must contain sufficient bibliographic information to enable readers to locate the cited source.

Bibliographic references should be prepared consistently in English. Whenever available, each reference should include a persistent identifier (e.g., DOI).

Examples of citation formats are provided in the manuscript template.

## **Data Citation**

Research data used or generated during the study must be properly cited in the reference list in the same manner as other scholarly sources.

A data citation should include:

- author(s);
- title of the dataset;
- name of the repository;
- year of publication;
- persistent identifier (e.g., DOI).

Proper data citation ensures appropriate credit for data creators and enhances the traceability and reproducibility of scientific results.
